Circle of Security Parenting Programme

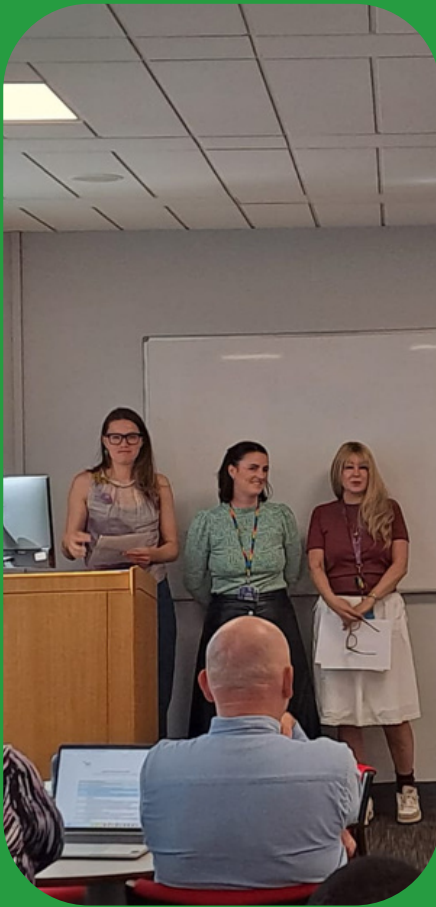
